Prevent Summer Slide & Enroll in the Remington Library's Summer Reading


The tendency for students to lose some of their academic achievement gained during the school year over the summer is termed “summer slide.” By enrolling your child in the Remington Library’s summer reading program is one way to help prevent “summer slide.” Our summer reading program runs June 1 to July 31. Children, teens (and adults!) all may join our summer reading and receive prizes as goals are met. This summer bring your child to the library and let them select reading material they would enjoy reading. Also, choose a book for yourself. When your children see you read often it will encourage them to read.

Here at the Remington Library, we also offer educational and fun activities throughout the summer-and they’re free. This year’s summer reading theme is “Adventures Begin & Your Library.” We will start our adventuresome summer with a petting zoon on June 1st. Every Tuesday in June at 2:30pm we will offer a children’s program. On Monday, June 10 at 7pm Prophetstown State Park will visit with a program for teens and adults: Crafting with Plants. You may also find a list of our summer programs on our web page, www.rctpl.lib.in.us and social media pages; Facebook and Instagram. A complete list of activities will be out by early May.

This year’s summer reading theme is “Adventures Begin & Your Library.” You may join anytime during summer, just visit the Remington Library and sign up. When signing up you will receive a folder with your reading record, rules, and program dates. You do not have to join the reading program to participate in the summer activities. We do ask that you sign up for each program you wish to attend so we have supplies for everyone that wishes to participate. Remember these are free programs. Remington Library hours are Monday and Tuesday form 10am-7pm, Wednesday and Friday for 10am-7pm, and Saturday from 9am-1pm. We are closed on Thursday and Sunday. All Tri-County students are welcome to use our library and participate in our programs.

GRAINS
Whole grains give kids B vitamins, minerals, and fiber to help them feel fuller longer so they stay alert to concentrate at school.

VEGETABLES
A variety of vegetables helps kids get the nutrients and fiber they need for good health.

MILK
Low-fat (1%) or Fat-free milk. Children and teens need the calcium, protein, and vitamin D found in milk for strong bones, teeth and muscles.

PROTEIN FOODS
Meat, poultry, fish, dry beans, peas, eggs, nuts, and seeds provide many nutrients including protein and iron. Portion sizes are based upon the nutrition needs of children in various grade groups.
