FROM THE KITCHEN...

We celebrated National School Breakfast Week at the High School 3-7/3-11 with new items. The kids were excited to see and test new menus. It was a success.

As we look toward the next school year, we face challenges again. On 3-10-22 we were told our program will return to PRE-COVID regulations by the USDA. Ag Secretary Vilsack is releasing more information on 3-17-22.

Food Directors across the US sent letters & traveled to Washington DC. to voice our concerns and gain support. The SNA still gives some hope (until 6-30-22) of being heard. In simple form, the USDA can only extend the waivers if Congress gives them permission. We continue to write our Congress people on behalf of the food programs.

What this looks like for the next school year is, *If your family needs assistance for meals or book fees, You must complete the FREE/REDUCED form.* It will be processed and applicants will be notified of the outcome by mail. We suggest you complete the application when registering for school. It can take up to 10 days to process.

Those who don't apply and receive assistance will be required to pay the full amount for meals and book fees. *Meals will not be free for the 2022-2023 school year* unless Congress steps in and gives support. More information will be available at the beginning of the new school year.

On the positive side we have implemented new scratch recipes from the State to serve our students. They are responding with higher participation and a lot of thank you's.

We'll close by saying thank you for your support to our students, parents and community. "We are Tri-County!"

NURSE'S NOTES – APRIL & MAY



Kindergarten round up will be on April 7th from 8:30 am-1 pm and 2 pm-5pm for incoming kindergarten students. You may meet with a school nurse at this time to go over any health concerns you may have regarding your child. All kindergarten students will need to have their immunizations up to date to begin kindergarten. Please bring a copy of your student's immunization record and birth certificate with you to the kindergarten round-up.

On April 20, 2022 School Smiles wil be coming to TCP and TCI. School Smiles in a comprehensive dental program servicing school systems. They provide dental care for the insured and uninsured students. Dental services provided include: cleaning, x-rays, fluoride, sealants, restorative care, free dentals supplies all conveniently done while the student is at school. Flyers for registration will be sent home with students in their red folders soon. You may also register your child by going to schoolsmiles.com/student-signup.

The 4th grade boys and girls will be having their growth and development movie in May. More information will be sent home to 4th grade students soon.

Parents/Guardians of 5th graders and 11th graders will be receiving a letter regarding the required immunizations that must be received before school starts next fall. The letter will explain what is needed and contain a copy of the current immunizations. Please take the immunization record with you when the shots are administered.

As the year draws to a close, you can see that much has been happening with your nurses. There hasn't been a dull moment! It has been a good year and we are already looking forward to a great next year.
